



Steve Gillette got his start in the small folk music clubs around Southern California, and rapidly gained the respect of other musicians, club owners, and audiences.

Steve was formally introduced to eastern audiences in September of 1966 when he was invited to appear at the Philadelphia Folk Festival. In *Broadside Magazine's* review of that festival, Steve was described as "the surprise of the evening." Since then, Steve has been in demand in clubs and on college campuses all over the country.

Steve appeared, by invitation of the Canadian Government, at the Youth Pavilion at Expo '67 in Montreal. He has also been a favorite in the Disneyland summer concert series, the Mariposa Folk Festival in Toronto, and the Beers Family Festival in Fox Hollow, New York. A major creative talent, Steve has written the top selling hit song, "Back on the Street Again."



Rotating literature course

The American Heritage was taught to eleventh grade general English. The new course took three quarters of the school year. Rotating literature quarter was spent in study of general English. American Heritage program was divided into three one-week units, each taught by different teachers, these were American Humanism, American English, and American Literature. Auto Instruction

Mr. George Frater, auto technology instructor, is proud of the fact that his 12th grade students are working on "low cost" automobiles that are entering roll out of the school into the road, guaranteed to perform well.

"Jays and Tons, push the truck out and leave in the Afternoon. 'Till off the street," says the teacher who says he has a job tomorrow morning available now.

Frater was invited by Ford Motor Company to Dearborn, Mich., last summer. He studied the latest methods of the automotive industry and came back to Boring High with \$1,000 worth of teaching aids.

"They installed manuals, hardware, files, and overlays of the latest design along with a course of study that covers all aspects of practical training," he said.

The emphasis is on practicality, on knowing how to do what. "This doesn't practice enough basic knowledge to enable students to switch from car to car or to detect any innovations that might come along," he explained.

The last year of auto technology was taught by Mr. Tom Lindblad. The class, called Beginning auto mechanics, works on all the parts of the automobile separately.

Students' shop is lined with work tables. Standing over Pacific magazine assembled parts. There a die table is available.

In the second year, students grade are in two automobiles and learn to diagnose and correct troubles.

Under such steps on the walls as "Five planning prevents poor performance", and "Think Quality" help to actually handle tasks with the accuracy of real jobs.

"They know that if they are good, they'll be stretched up by double stops and garages where trained mechanics are well needed," said Frater.

"The past year, for the first time, local Ford dealers will take the best students from the class for a work experience program. Their school schedule will be adjusted accordingly," he adds.

One of the boys grinding valves looks up. "You'd I'd decide to become a master chef, it's always an option working on my car."





Fortunately we were able to field a team (sans a coach or two) full of confidence but with few if any experienced ball players. We were "green" and untried at virtually all key positions, but we felt that we could even our share of games.

We went to Santa Monica and lost (13-6) to a team that ended their season undefeated and champs of the Bay League.

Next we played Santa Paula and the score does not indicate the closeness of the game. They too ended up co-champs of the Frontier League.

In our first league game we finally moved the ball well against one of the better defenses in the league. We still lost, 14-7.

Our next two games were played on Saturday afternoons with the East Winds howling. Thousand Oaks and Camarillo were both too "hot" for us.

We finally broke our losing streak by tying Oxnard, 7-7.

By far our finest game was against a big and tough Santa Barbara team. We played up to our potential and won, 35-7. Needless to say this was a historical moment, for it was Buena's first football win over the Don's.

In the mud we lost to Haverste, 26-6. Finally, in an error filled game (7 fumbles and innumerable other mistakes) we lost to Ventura.

Football, like life, has its high points and low points. The mark of a team is how they handle either extreme. We never lost our enthusiasm, our drive, or our desire to win; consequently, our season was successful from the standpoint of learning to live with adversity. We dealt with one problem after another but we never looked back, and we never quit!
